

Documents certifying proficiency in English¹

1. A certificate, diploma or other document certifying proficiency in English across the four language skills—listening, reading, speaking and writing—at language proficiency levels B2, C1 or C2, issued by:
 - 1) University of Cambridge, ESOL Examinations:
 - B2 First (FCE),
 - C1 Advanced (CAE),
 - C2 Proficiency (CPE),
 - B2 Business Vantage (BEC Vantage),
 - C1 Business Higher,
 - Certificate in English for International Business and Trade (CEIBT);
 - 2) University of Cambridge, ESOL Examinations, British Council, IDP IELTS Australia: International English Language Testing System IELTS – a score of at least 5.5;
 - 3) Trinity College London:
 - ESOL Skills for Life – Level 1 (B2) or higher,
 - Integrated Skills in English (ISE) – ISE II or higher,
 - ISE Digital – over 80 points (B2);
 - 4) Educational Testing Service (ETS):
 - Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) – Internet-Based Test (iBT) – a minimum score of 72,
 - Test of English for International Communication (TOEIC) – a minimum of: 785 points in the Listening & Reading section, 150 points in the Speaking section and 160 points in the Writing section;
 - 5) Pearson Assessment English:
 - Pearson English International Certificate – paper-based and computer-based versions (formerly Pearson Test of English General (PTE) or London Tests of English) – Level 3 (Edexcel Certificate in ESOL International Level 1 – grades Pass, Merit, Distinction) or higher,
 - Pearson Test of English Academic (PTE Academic), both in-person and online versions – a minimum score of 59;
 - 6) LanguageCert (PeopleCert Qualifications (PCQ)):
 - LanguageCert International ESOL – LanguageCert Level 1 Certificate in ESOL International (Listening, Reading, Writing) (Communicator B2), also known as: LanguageCert International ESOL Communicator B2 Listening, Reading, Writing or higher, including the LanguageCert Level 1 Certificate in ESOL International (Speaking) (Communicator B2), also known as LanguageCert International ESOL Communicator B2 Speaking or higher,
 - LanguageCert Academic – LanguageCert Level 1 Certificate in ESOL International (Listening, Reading, Writing, Speaking) (LanguageCert Academic B2) or higher,

- LanguageCert Test of English – LanguageCert Level 1 Certificate in ESOL International (Listening, Reading, Writing, Speaking) (LanguageCert Test of English B2) or higher;
- 7) Education Development International (EDI), London Chamber of Commerce and Industry Examinations Board: London Chamber of Commerce and Industry Examinations (LCCI):
 - English for Business Level 2 or higher,
 - Foundation Certificate for Teachers of Business English (FTBE);
 - 8) European Consortium for the Certificate of Attainment in Modern Languages – Level B2 (Vantage) or higher;
 - 9) TELC – telc GmbH, WBT Weiterbildungs-Testsysteme GmbH:
 - Certificate in English,
 - Certificate in English for Business Purposes,
 - Certificate in English for Technical Purposes,
 - telc English,
 - telc English Business,
 - telc English Technical,
 - telc English University.
2. A certificate of completion of a preparatory course for university studies, lasting at least 9 months, attesting to proficiency in English across the four language skills—listening, reading, speaking and writing—at language proficiency levels B2, C1 or C2.
 3. A 1st cycle studies, 2nd cycle studies or long-cycle studies diploma in English studies or applied linguistics awarded by a higher education institution operating within the higher education and science system of the Republic of Poland or by a foreign higher education institution, together with a diploma supplement or a certificate confirming that the number of hours of English language classes amounted to at least 500.
 4. A 1st cycle studies, 2nd cycle studies or long-cycle studies diploma issued by a higher education institution operating within the higher education and science system of the Republic of Poland or by a foreign higher education institution, stating that English was the language of instruction for the degree programme; and, if the degree diploma does not contain such information, additionally, a diploma supplement or a certificate stating that the programme was taught in English.
 5. International Baccalaureate Diploma – in relation to the core language (<https://www.ibo.org/programmes/diploma-programme/>).
 6. European Baccalaureate Diploma – in relation to the first (L1) or second (L2) language (<https://www.eursec.eu/en/European-Schools/European-Baccalaureate>).
 7. A certificate confirming eligibility to practise as a sworn translator of English issued by the Minister of Justice, or a certificate confirming inclusion on the register of sworn translators of English.
